# Start of work on Railway Parade landscaping from Tuesday 13 December 2022

Together, the Australian Government and the NSW Government are investing more than \$2.5 billion towards upgrading the East and West Sections of the Great Western Highway between Katoomba and Lithgow.

Transport for NSW is starting work to remediate the verge along Railway Parade, Medlow Bath between Rutland Road and St Albans Road after 16 mature trees were removed along the eastbound verge of the Great Western Highway near Bellevue Crescent as part of a previous safety upgrade that provided a dedicated right turn lane, widened shoulder and new guardrail.

The first week of work will involve weeding and clearing. This will be followed by garden bed preparation and planting and mulching.

We will be working between **7am** and **6pm** from **Monday** to **Friday** and some Saturdays between **7am** and **1pm** with work being completed by **March 2023**, weather permitting. We will continue to update the community as the project progresses.

#### How will the work affect you?

The first month of work will involve limited use of an excavator which generates some noise. We will make every effort to minimise noise by undertaking the works during the day and turning off machinery and vehicles when not in use. All work will occur within the road verge and will not impact pedestrian access or the Great Western Highway.

#### **Traffic changes**
