

Redbank and Tap Hill overtaking lanes south of Coonabarabran



The Newell Highway Program Alliance (NHPA) is excited to announce the completion of three more overtaking lanes; Redbank, Tap Hill and lower Tap Hill. These projects have created an additional 3.5 kilometres of overtaking lane on the Newell Highway.

The NHPA is joint-funded by the Australian and NSW Government's to deliver about 40 overtaking lanes over four years on the Newell Highway. The projects will improve safety, reduce travel times and improve freight efficiency as part of the \$700 million Newell Highway upgrade.

Work on all three projects started in mid-2020 and motorists experienced delays of less than 1.5 minutes during construction.
