

Aboriginal heritage salvage works from 15 August

Community update | August 2022

Transport for NSW is continuing work on the North West Growth Area Road Network Strategy by progressing plans for the Denmark Link Road project.

The Denmark Link Road project includes constructing the missing local road connections between Garfield Road West, Riverstone and Bridge Street near Westminster Street Bridge, Schofields.

Aboriginal archaeological assessment completed for the project as part of the Review of Environmental Factors (REF) identified the area surrounding Denmark Road and New Link Road as an Aboriginal heritage site. As a result, Transport for NSW will be carrying out salvage excavations per the project's Aboriginal Heritage Impact Permit.



Our work schedule

We will be on site for 25 day shifts from Monday 15 August until Friday 15 September. Our work hours will be 7am to 6pm Monday to Friday.

How will the work affect you?

Work will include a team of heritage professionals in collaboration with local Aboriginal communities collecting artefacts from the surface, taking photos, labelling and bagging salvaged items. Aboriginal stakeholders will then decide the new location of these items.

Hand tools will be used and following completion of salvage work, disturbed soil will be made safe. Light vehicles such as utility vehicles will be used to move staff and equipment around and a water truck maybe required. The work will not be noisy.
