## Faulconbridge Station Upgrade

**Project update**

**May 2020**

The Faulconbridge Station Upgrade is being delivered as part of the Transport Access Program, a NSW Government initiative to provide a better experience for public transport customers by delivering accessible, modern, secure and integrated transport infrastructure.

### Project overview

Transport for NSW is upgrading Faulconbridge Station to make it easier for everyone to access, including people with a disability, limited mobility, parents/carers with prams and customers with luggage.

The project includes two new lifts and upgraded ramp, upgrades to the station building including improved access to the waiting room and station facilities, new unisex ambulant and a family accessible toilets, new wayfinding signage and upgrades to station security and communication systems.

### Upcoming work and site establishment

Work will begin on **Monday 11 May 2020** for site establishment activities. These include:

- installing site sheds and fencing (near the Commuter Car Park and around lift locations)
- relocation and provision of temporary services, including site electrical supply

Equipment which will be used during this work includes: small drilling rig, excavators, surveying equipment, generators, delivery/concrete trucks and hand tools.

### Temporary traffic changes

Throughout our work, there may be occasional temporary traffic changes at **Great Western Highway near Faulconbridge Station, including single lane road closures** to accommodate large vehicles undertaking construction work and to enable removal of rock/spoil from the lift closest to the Great Western Highway.

Traffic control and signage will also be in place to help pedestrians and motorists with these temporary changes.

Please be advised that the informal parking area on the Sir Henrys Parade side of the station will not be available during site establishment work.

## Construction hours

To support the industry and continue the delivery of critical infrastructure, the NSW Government has introduced new rules allowing construction sites to operate on weekends and public holidays.

**Standard construction hours are now 7am to 6pm every day, including public holidays.**

These changes have been made to facilitate social distancing on construction sites and support the health and wellbeing of workers.

We understand extending construction hours to include weekends and public holidays may cause disruption for the community but all efforts will be made to minimise impacts where possible and ensure strict environmental conditions relating to noise, vibration and dust management are adhered to.

Thank you for your patience as work continues on important transport infrastructure across NSW.

## Weekend work – 16 and 17 May 2020

Some work is being planned during a scheduled Sydney Trains trackwork period, when no trains will be running. Work will be carried out from **6am to 6pm on Saturday 16 and Sunday 17 May**. This work will involve using excavators, mobile crane, power tools, and drill rigs to start excavation in the two lift locations. The construction equipment will be positioned as far away from residential areas as possible with regular respite periods during noisy work.




The pedestrian footbridge will remain open during this period.
